

## Shipping livestock by air

- 1- It is essential that accurate final weights of livestock are obtained in view of the weight limitations imposed by the load capabilities of the aircraft and the space required per animal.
  - 2- Shipper's and consignee's full names, addresses, and telephone numbers are attached to the container.
  - 3- 24-hour emergency contact name and telephone number of person available to take full responsibility (if different from shipper or consignee) are attached to the container.
  - 4- Duplicate shipper's instructions for the animal's care affixed to the outside of the container.
  - 5- Any medication that has been given should be recorded on the container.
  - 6- To ship a livestock by air the following documents must be available prior to departure:
    - a. Import Permit,
    - b. Health Certification,
    - c. Vaccination certificate
    - d. Ministry of agriculture certificate if any
    - e. Shipper's Certificate.

- 1) The shipper's responsibilities for shipping animals by air consist of preparing the animal for transport. The shipper must fill out all appropriate paperwork legibly and in full. They must make the proper reservations. It is the shipper's responsibility to ensure the animals are placed in proper containers and that the containers are appropriately marked and labeled. They also need to provide the consignee and emergency contact information in case any issues arise.
